### Hotel Registration



## Invitation to the World's Leading Conference on Land Use and Environmental Law

## Land Use and Environmental Law

Join over 100 law professors from all regions of the world for a comparative analysis of land use and environmental law. Leading academics will examine how land use laws and practices either advance or complicate sustainable development. Panels evaluate land use in the context of both urban re-development, and natural resource management.

Opening on the United Nations' World Habitat Day, this 2nd Colloquium of the IUCN Academy of Environmental Law assembles, for the first time, comparative studies of how land use laws work, in practice as well as in theory, in both developing and developed regions, with varied legal traditions. Case studies will evaluate how environmental laws have made re-development possible in various cities, and how techniques such as integrated coastal zone management have facilitated compatible economic development of natural resources, human settlements, commerce, and nature conservation.

The Colloquium also features a set of distinguished lectures, synthesizing the field of environmental law. In 2004, the honored lecturer will be **Prof. Akio Morishima** of Japan. Founder of the environmental law programs of Sophia University, laureate of the Elizabeth Haub Prize in Environmental Law, Dr. Morishima chairs the Environment Council for the government of Japan, and is one of the "fathers" of environmental law internationally. The Cambridge University Press will publish his lectures, and the edited research papers from the colloquium, in 2005.

Land use laws are invariably national and local, and rarely are examined in an international format. The IUCN Academy's 2nd Colloquium is the first research seminar ever to examine how these laws work when measured against transnational and global policies of environmental law and sustainable development.

The Cambridge University Press will publish the edited research papers presented at this Colloquium, and will release the IUCN Academy's study from the 1st Colloquium, Energy Law for Sustainable Development, at this 2nd Colloquium.

### Highlights of the Colloquium's presentations during this four-day event include:

Keynote Address by **Dr. Ali Mohamed Mekouar**, Head of the Legal Office of the United Nations' Food and Agricultural Organization (Rome, Italy). Distinguished speakers include **Prof. Klaus Bosselmann** (Auckland, N.Z.) on ethical dimensions in land stewardship, and a global gathering of experts, including, among others, **Charles O. Okidi**, Albert Mumma and Okoth Ogendo (Kenya), Prof. **Jan Glazewski** (South Africa) and **Prof. Hillary Masundire** (Botswana), and Professors from Europe, such as **Prof. Michel Prieur** (Limoges, France) and **Prof. Ekhard Reh binder** (Germany) and from North America, such as **Prof. Nathalie Chalifour** (Ottawa) and **Prof. Jose Juan Gonzales** (Mexico), **Linda Malone** (William & Mary) and John Nolon (Pace), from Australia, such as **Ben Boer** (Sydney) and **Michael Jeffery** (Macquarie), from Brazil, such as **Rubens Morato Leite** and **Antonio Herman Benjamin**, from Asia, such as **Prof. Koh Kheng Lian** (Singapore) and **Wang Xi** (China).
